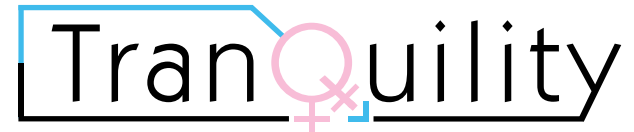
Meetings are held at **HealthStreet**, a University of Florida building located on **2401 SW Archer Road in Gainesville**
